The IBDP provides both balance and depth, preparing students for success at university and beyond. Unlike many programmes, it explicitly teaches the learning attributes students are expected to achieve and whilst there are exams at the end of the course around one third of the assessment is based on coursework.

Students study six subjects: three at Higher Level (HL) and three at Standard Level (SL); choosing one subject from each of the subject groups; Language & Literature, Language Acquisition, Individuals & Societies, Sciences, Mathematics and either Arts or a second from another group. This combination offers an appealing breadth of study whilst allowing specialisation. One of the reasons universities place a high value on the IB Diploma Programme.

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THE CORE

The core is made up of three parts which aim to broaden students' educational experience and challenge them to apply their knowledge and skills to new and novel areas.

THEORY OF KNOWLEDGE (TOK)

TOK asks students to reflect on the nature of knowledge, and on how we know what we claim to know. Assessment is through an exhibition and essay

CREATIVITY, ACTIVITY, SERVICE (C<u>AS)</u>_____

Enables students to enhance their personal development by learning through experience. It provides enjoyable opportunities for selfdetermination and collaboration with others, fostering a sense of accomplishment through creative, active and service opportunities

EXTENDED ESSAY (EE)

An independent, self directed piece of research where students investigate a topic of personal interest, which relates to one of their six DP subjects

The IBCP comprises IB subjects, personal and professional skills and a career-related study, which at Ryde is taught through three distinct BTEC pathways. The IB subjects provide the theoretical underpinning and academic rigour, whilst the career-related study provides practical, real-world approaches to learning.

The IBCP core is designed to develop skills and competencies required for lifelong learning and this combination satisfies the entry requirements of the majority of universities. The IBCP will suit students who have a strong interest in continuing academic study but also wish to develop skills for their career development. Students study two Higher Level (HL) or three Standard Level (SL) subjects, alongside a career-related BTEC course and IB core subjects.

BUSINESS

A detailed insight into the methods, motivators and risks involved in running a business. Units cover areas such as Personal and Business Finance, Developing a Marketing Campaign and Recruitment and Selection Processes

PERFORMING ARTS

Students will develop an understanding of the key elements of performance, this will involve theatrical research, skills and techniques in various performance disciplines and group performances

SPORT

Students will examine the academic and theoretical side of sport, as well as look at the practical and vocational side of sport, allowing students to experience and get involved in a variety of sporting environments that our sports industry offers.



The A Level Plus Programme provides a range of A Level subjects alongside additional enrichment subjects, offering much more than most schools. A Levels enable students to focus on subjects that reflect their personal interest and future career ideas. All subjects are two year courses with examinations at the end of the Upper Sixth. A small number may include an element of coursework.

Students select their choice of three A Levels from four option blocks plus a fourth enrichment of an IB Standard Level subject, A Level Further Maths or the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ). This enriched A Level course provides a point of difference for our students when they apply for university courses.

EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION

Those taking A Levels may also take the **Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)**. This gives students the opportunity to demonstrate a wide range of academic skills and show prospective universities that they are proactive, capable of independent study and have wider academic interests in and around their subject choices. The EPQ can be taken either as an enrichment option (in which case students have timetabled periods during the week to work on their project) or alternatively they can take it in addition to an enrichment option (completed in the students own time but with support from teaching staff).
